

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REMINDERS...

School starts: at 8.50am, for all children, and the day ends at 3.15pm.

Dogs on site: please leave your dogs at the School or Church gates and not enter the school grounds, once we are dropping off at the back playground.

Parking: we have been reminded by the Parish Council not to park on the grass verges outside of School and the Church.

Attendance: please contact the **school office** by 9:30am, if your child is unable to attend school. We are not able to authorise holidays in term time and any absence will be recorded as <u>un</u>authorised.

Communication: we prefer that you use the **telephone or email** for formal communication - absence, pupils wellbeing - academic and pastoral. We have an 'open door' policy for you to have face to face communication for a chat with any one of us at any time. **Class Dojo** — is an informal communication between school and parents for very brief messages. **Class story** is used for a link to Padlet. **Padlet** is the overview of the week's learning and it is uploaded onto the school website.

Illness: we follow Government guidance for details of when children can attend school when they are ill. Some illnesses require you to keep your child away from school for a set period of time to limit the spread of any infection in school e.g. sickness/diarrhoea requires a 48hour absence after the symptoms have stopped.

Mediciation and antibiotics: we will support children who require medication and antibiotics in school. Parents are responsible for bringing and collecting medication each day and must complete the necessary forms, prior to the medication being administered. Medication should be in its original packaging and the childs name on the pharmacy label. Antibiotics prescribed <u>three</u> times a day <u>should</u> be taken out of the school day (breakfast, after school, bedtime).



Miss. Thomas' Dotterels KS1 - Year 1 & 2

This half term we will be looking at the books 'The Way Back Home', Non-Fiction chronological report about Pirates and the poem 'Firework Night'. In Numeracy, we are continuing to use White Rose Maths to look at place value to 10 and to 100 exploring our resources and symbols.

We are continuing to learn through the topic 'Here we go...'. Within Science we are focusing on seasonal change, weather patterns and the impact it has on our life/world. In our Art and Design afternoons we are working with our inspiration Andy Warhol to print and create patterns. In both History and Geography, we are researching our local area looking carefully at physical and human features. We are learning about E-Safety and using technology sensibly.

We have started our preparations for the Christmas play. All children will be participating and have a role in our play 'Shine Star, Shine'.

If you have any of the following we would love to have them in school to help with this terms learning: Milk /cardboard bottles/1L bottles, Tins cleaned and label-less, Tinker items – unwanted technology to be explored and taken apart by children and tools such as screwdrivers and hand held drills.

Mrs. Hoskins' Cuckoos EYFS - Reception

This half term our focus books are 'Perfectly Norman', National Geographic 'Penguins' and the poem 'Ride a Cock Horse'. We are using the White Rose Maths scheme and our current focus is 'Light and Dark' where we will be learning number composition, more and less and simple shapes.

We will continue learning through the topic 'Here we go...'. This will involve looking at our local area and beyond. We will be carefully observing and monitoring daily weather patterns looking at how this links to our current season. Our focus within art will be printing and pattern. We will use our focus artist Andy Warhol to inspire us.
